The story of L.P. Statile Inc. begins in 1912 when Leonardo Statile immigrated from Italy to New Jersey where he worked as a propagator for various nurseries. In 1922, after learning the trade and saving up, he purchased the existing property in Springfield to start his own growing operation. Springfield Nursery, as it was known then, was a propagation/production nursery, growing broadleaf evergreens and specializing in Azaleas and Rhododendron. The business was successful through the depression and World War II. In 1956 Leonardo passed away and the business was passed to his son Philip who had recently returned from war and started a family. Philip and his brother-in-law Bill ran the nursery for the next 30+ years. The nursery prospered under their leadership and expanded its growing operation to another facility 40 miles south in Colts Neck, NJ. In the meantime, Phil's son, Leonard P. Statile, graduated from Rutgers University with a degree in Landscape Architecture. Working as a landscape architect, he saw an opportunity to develop a full-service horticultural distribution center in Springfield. His vision was to be a one stop shop for landscapers to procure all their plant needs for a job. In 1974, L.P. Statile, Inc. was formed to provide landscape contractors with both B&B and container plants. Upon Philip and Bill's retirement, Leonard was named President of Springfield Nursery. He merged both companies into what we are still known as today, L.P. Statile, Inc. Leonard's son Philip worked in the family business from a young age learning all aspects of the operation. Philip worked off and on at the nursery while earning a bachelor's degree in Business Management from Seton Hall University. Once he completed his degree Philip returned to the nursery full time working in both production and sales. On January 1st, 2022 Philip was named President and CEO of L.P. Statile Inc. making him the 4th generation to lead the company.





ABELIA

'Canyon Creek' 3'-5' Canyon Creek Abelia

White flowers with pink accents. New growth emerges peachy-orange fading to yellow and then green as the leaf matures.

'Little Richard' 3' Little Richard Abelia

Very compact - 3' by 3', glossy foliage, good fall color, white flowers.

NEW 'Radiance' 3' (PP21929) Radiance Abelia

Easy care shrub displays silvery-green and creamy white variegated foliage on dark red stems. Flowers are small, white, and trumpet-shaped in summer. Compact habit, semi-evergreen, grows 3' tall, and 4' wide.

'Rose Creek' 2'-3' Rose Creek Abelia

Leaves emerge with a pinkish cast on crimson stems, mature to dark green and turn purple-green in winter. Pink buds, white flowers. Compact - only 2'-3' feet tall and wide.

'Kaleidoscope' 2'-3' Kaleidoscope Abelia

Striking variegated growth. New leaves emerge bright red and green gradually maturing to dark green with gold margins. Fragrant white flowers through summer. (PP-16,988)

ACER

griseum 20'-30' Paperbark Maple

Unique exfoliating, cinnamon colored bark, beautiful orange-red fall foliage color.

palmatum

'Bloodgood' 15'-20' Japanese Maple

Upright maple. Retains its red color throughout the season.

'Emperor 1' 15'-17' Japanese Maple

Mid-sized red leaf maple maxing out at 15-17'H.

'Fireglow' 12'-15' Japanese Maple

A great substitution for the invasive 'Crimson King' Norway Maple.

'Armstrong' 50-60' Red Maple

50-60' tall and only 25' wide. Fast growing columnar form. Excellent fall color comes early.

A late winter, or very early spring-flowering shrub famous throughout the south-eastern United States. Nice, glossy, evergreen foliage, beautiful flowers. Thrives in the shade.

CARPINUS**betulus****'Fastigiata' 30'-40'****Columnar Hornbeam**

Dense, compact narrow canopy (20'-30' Wide). Nicely textured leaves.

'Frans Fontaine' 30'-40' Frans Fontaine Hornbeam

Slow-growing, deciduous, small to medium-sized understory native tree with an attractive oval form.

Fast growing deciduous shrubs with magnificent blue flowers in late summer.

'Dark Knight' 2'-3'**Dark Knight Bluebeard**

Deep purple-blue flowers, compact growth habit.

CEDRUS**atlantica****'Glauca' 40'-60'****Blue Atlas Cedar**

A rapid-growing evergreen with bright blue foliage. A great specimen plant.

'Glauca Pendula' 8'-12' Weeping Blue Atlas Cedar

Interesting form of Atlas Cedar, easily trained into various forms including espaliered and serpentine.

deodara**'Feelin' Blue' 4'-6'****Feelin' Blue Deodar Cedar**

Dwarf, blue needles, irregular shape, no central leader. Stunning.

'Feelin' Sunny' 5'-6'**Feelin' Sunny Deodar Cedar**

Bright, golden yellow foliage, dwarf plant. Slowly grows to 15' wide. Striking.

'Snow Sprite' 4'-5'**Snow Sprite Deodar Cedar**

Ivory white new growth that turns creamy yellow in summer. Dwarf form growing 4-5' tall and 4' wide. A great small specimen.

CELTIS**occidentalis 40'-60'****Common Hackberry**

Great tree for difficult spots. Tolerates dry, windy, sunny locations. Medium fast grower, birds love the fruit.

CEPHALATHUS**occidentalis****Common Buttonbush**

This multi-stemmed North American native shrub/small tree grows 8-12' tall. Its flowers are white pincushion and bloom June-September. They attract many pollinators such as bees and butterflies to the garden. Grows best in organic rich, moist soil.

CEPHALOTAXUS**harringtonia****'Duke Gardens' 3'-5'****Duke Gardens Japanese Plum Yew**

Mounded, slow growing, evergreen, arching pendulous branches with wonderful needle-like leaves. Grows in deep shade, deer resistant.

CEPHALOTAXUS—continued—**'Prostrata' 2'-3'h x 5'-6'w Spreading Japanese Plum Yew**

Unique evergreen shrub that is growing in popularity. Grows in deep shade, deer resistant. Low growing, arching, pendulous branches with needle-like leaves.

'Fastigiata' 6'-10'h Upright Japanese Plum Yew

Unique evergreen shrub grows in deep shade, deer resistant. Dense, stiff upright branches with needle-like leaves.

CERCIDIPHYLLUM**japonicum 40'-60' Katsura Tree**

Excellent symmetrical tree. New spring foliage has a reddish color, changing to a blue-green in the summer with an apricot-yellow fall color.

CERCIS**canadensis 20'-30' Eastern Redbud**

A small wide upright native tree with purple flowers along the branches in early spring before the foliage emerges. Yellow fall foliage. Prefers part shade.

canadensis**'Appalachian Red' 15'-25' Appalachian Red Redbud**

Dark Pink flowering variety. Eye catching.

'Forest Pansy' 20'-30' Forest Pansy Redbud

Beautiful red new growth changing to green, along with traditional purple flowers.

'Ruby Falls' 6'-8' Ruby Falls Redbud

Dwarf weeping habit - purple leaves. Striking. (PPAF)

CHAMAECYPARIS**pisifera 'Filifera Aurea' 8'-15' Goldthread Cypress**

Compact feathery gold foliaged evergreen.

nootkatensis 'Glauca Pendula' 20'-35' Weeping Alaskan Cedar

Picturesque, upright evergreen with pendulous branches.

obtusa**'Aurea' 8'-12' Golden Hinoki Cypress**

Gold foliage variety. Excellent specimen.

'Compacta' 10'-15' Compact Hinoki Cypress

Slow growing, dense pyramidal form - a great variety.

'Confucius' 10'-12' Confucius Hinoki Cypress

Shades of gold and light green, layered branches. Slow growing.

'Crippsii' 20'+ Cripp's Golden Hinoki Cypress

Gold foliage variety. Grows slowly at first but will eventually get big. Beautiful slightly upright, golden, frond like branches. Tolerates ½ day of shade. Very interesting variety.

'Gracilis' 12'-15' Hinoki Cypress

Slow growing upright evergreen with glossy, very dark green foliage, good color year round.

'Kosteri' 4'-5' Koster's False Cypress

A dwarf form of Hinoki Cypress. Pyramidal at maturity.

'Nana Gracilis' 2'-4' Dwarf Hinoki Cypress

Irregularly globose. Dense, dark green, compact foliage. Extremely slow growing.

CHIONANTHUS**virginicus 15'-20' White Fringetree**

Fragrant, tassel-like flowers bloom May-June. Unique native tree.

CLADRASTIS**kentukea 30'-50' American Yellowwood**

Excellent native tree for flowers and foliage. Bright green leaves turn soft yellow in fall. Pendulous fragrant white flowers.

CLETHRA**alnifolia 5'-7' Summersweet****'Ruby Spice' 4'-6'****Vanilla Spice® 'Caleb' 4'-6' (PP-21,589) (PW)**

Native shrub with spicy, fragrant, white flowers (alnifolia, Vanilla Spice) or pink (Ruby Spice) in summer. Thrives in moist, partially shady conditions.

'Hummingbird' 2'-3'

Spicy, fragrant, white flowers. Dwarf growth habit.

'Sixteen Candles' 3'-4'

Fragrant white flowers. Dense, compact habit.

CORNUS**alba 'Bailhalo' 4'-6' Ivory Halo Variegated Red Twig**

Variegated foliage, dark red stems

florida 15'-35' White Dogwood

By far, our finest native flowering tree. White May flowers are durable and persistent. Excellent fall color ranges from deep scarlet to orange, enhanced by red berries in tight clusters.

Pink flowers in spring - striking bright red fall foliage. Grows 15 - 20 feet tall and wide. Produces berries that migrating birds covet.

'Cherokee Chief' 15'-20' Cherokee Chief Dogwood

Deep pink flowers in spring - showy red fall foliage. New growth comes out with a red blush, matures to green. Grows 20 - 25 feet wide.

'Cherokee Princess' 15'-20' Cherokee Princess Dogwood

Clear white flowers in spring - showy red fall foliage. Grows 20 - feet wide. Attractive red fruit in the fall.

rubra 15'-25' Pink Dogwood

Pastel pink flowers, effective as a specimen or when planted with white flowering dogwoods. A classic!

CORNUS —continued—**kousa 15'-30'** **Japanese Dogwood**

Native to Japan, this ornamental tree produces white flowers 3 weeks after *C. florida* varieties. Reddish fall color, red cherry sized fruit, and interesting exfoliating bark.

k. x 'Scarlet Fire'® (PP 28,311) **20'-25'****Scarlet Fire Flowering Dogwood**

Extremely dark pink flowers in late spring. New leaves have a purple tint, fall color is a bright red. Deep pink fruits. A stunner in bloom.

sericea 'Farrow' 3'-4' (PP-18,523) **Arctic Fire™ Red Twig Dogwood**

Compact multi-stemmed shrub. Striking bright red stems effective in winter months. Does not grow as tall as 'Bailey'.

'Bailey' 6'-8' **Red Twig Dogwood**

Broad spreading multi-stemmed shrub. Attractive bright red stems effective in winter months. White flowers, white fruit.

COTINUS**coggynria 'NCC01' 4'-5'** (PP-30,216) **Winecraft Black Smoke Bush**

Deep purple leaves all season, with a puffy pink-purple bloom that lasts through the summer. New and unique compact variety.

CRYPTOMERIA**japonica****'Globosa Nana' 4'-6'** **Dwarf Japanese Cedar**

Dome-shaped evergreen with needles that turn a beautiful rust color in winter. Slow grower. Great small specimen plant.

'Radicans' 50'-60' **Japanese Cedar**

Pyramidal form, blue-green foliage does not bronze in winter.

'Yoshino' 30'-40' **Japanese Cedar**

Fast growing, not as tall as some varieties, foliage bronzes in winter.

'Rein's Dense Jade' 15'-25'
Rein's Dense Jade Japanese Cedar

Upright, conical, contrasting new and old growth is very showy.



TAGGED MATERIAL: Material will be held for **7 DAYS ONLY** after notification of being ready for pick-up or being tagged in our landscape yard. We cannot be held responsible for it being there after this time. In November and December material will be held for 3 days only.

RETURNS: We do not encourage the return of any nursery stock. However, there will be a 20% handling charge on any nursery stock returned **ONLY** if accepted in the **EXACT** condition in which the material left the nursery. Returns must be made within 24 hours of initial purchase. A tarp is mandatory when transporting plant material.

DELIVERY SERVICE: Delivery may be arranged on our trucks at very reasonable rates, we wish only to cover our cost. Please make arrangements at least **3 TO 5 DAYS** in advance. Any delivery cancelled within 24 hours of delivery appointment will be charged a delivery fee.

QUANTITY RATES: Quantity rates apply only to the actual number of a given variety and size picked up or delivered at one time. Different sizes of the same variety or different varieties can **NOT** be added together to get quantity rates.

GUARANTEE: We have no control over conditions after plants leave the nursery, therefore, we will not replace stock that fail to live or thrive.

NEW JERSEY SALES TAX: Under the New Jersey Sales and Use Tax Act, we are required to collect a current rate sales tax on all nursery stock sold unless we have proper documentation that the sale is exempt.

1. Stock is exempt which will be resold with appropriate NJ Sales tax collected and we have been provided with a properly executed Resale Exemption Certification (Form ST-3), prior to stock being delivered.
2. Stock purchased from us and used by Federal, State of New Jersey, or New Jersey Municipal projects is non-taxable provided we have received prior to sale a Contractor's Exempt Purchaser Certificate (Form ST-13) for each individual order.
3. Stock which will be planted in our customer's nursery for growing on to a large size is exempt, if we have a properly executed Farmer's Exemption Certificate (Form ST-7).
4. Once you are invoiced for sales tax we **WILL NOT** make any refunds regardless of the reason!

PLEASE NOTE: Sales to landscape contractors are not tax-exempt, and New Jersey Sales Tax must be added by us to the invoice unless they qualify under #2 shown above.

Drop Ship Program

Plants: Net 30 days on house charge accounts. Prepayment of drop ship may be required prior to day of delivery, 2% per month added to unpaid balances after 30 days. Deposits or Pre-payment may be required until credit is established.

Freight: In many cases freight is included in the price of the plant. In other cases freight may be a separate charge payable at the time of delivery to the truck driver. We will alert you prior to shipment if the freight is C.O.D..




